Each year the Northeastern Association of Graduate Schools recognizes an outstanding master's thesis that has been produced by a student at one of its member institutions. Nominees must have received the master's degree within three years preceding the year of competition. Therefore, people who completed all requirements for the degree after January 1, 2016 are eligible.

The 2018-2019 Award will recognize a thesis in **Social Sciences & Education**.

The \$1,000 award will be presented at the annual meeting's award luncheon on Friday, April 12, 2019 at the Sonesta Philadelphia Rittenhouse Square. The recipient will be invited to attend the meeting as a guest of the Association and **must be present to receive the award**.

Every member institution is invited to submit a nomination. There can be only one nominee from each institution. Nomination materials, which should be transmitted by the Graduate Dean, include the thesis manuscript, a 300 word abstract in lay language, and three letters of evaluation. **Nomination materials in Adobe pdf file format must be submitted by email to NAGS.Awards@gmail.com. The deadline is January 15, 2019.** Receipt of nomination materials will be confirmed by the chair of the NAGS Master's Thesis Award Committee.
